







European Academy of Religion Call for Applications – Travel Grants 2026

Deadline for applications: March 20th, 2026

1. Overview

The European Academy of Religion is glad to announce the opening of the present call for applications for 30 travel grants of maximum 300,00 EUR to partially cover conference expenses for students and early-career researchers.

The travel grants cover registration fees for the European Academy of Religion's Ninth Annual Conference, travel expenses, and/or accommodation costs. No additional expenses are covered by the travel grants issued through this call for applications.

The travel grants referred to in the present call for applications are to be issued exclusively via reimbursements after the Conference and upon submission of the following documents in PDF format: receipt of registration fee, transportation tickets, accommodation receipts, and proof of payment.

If the travel expenses are inferior to the amount indicated above, the travel grant issued will be adjusted accordingly.

2. Eligibility

To participate in the present call for application for travel grants, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- a) Be an active student and/or early-career researcher. This includes all scholars under the age of 35 and all graduate students independent of age. If an applicant can demonstrate a longer period of leave (i.e., parental leave), the eligibility period shall be extended by the total duration of the leave taken.
- b) Be a member of the European Academy of Religion in 2026.
- c) Attend the European Academy of Religion's Ninth Annual Conference in Luiss University, Rome, from June 30th until July 3rd, 2026.

3. How to Apply

Applicants must submit the required documents in a single PDF to the following e-mail address: travelgrantseuare2026@gmail.com (this email address is to be used solely for the submission of the documentation necessary for the call for application. Any questions should be directed to Euare2026@thetriumph.com). The required documents for the present call for applications are the following:

- a) A brief statement of purpose of maximum 2,000 words.
- b) An updated curriculum vitae.









c) If the applicant is a Ph.D. student, a letter of support from their academic supervisor attesting to the quality of the application is also required.

4. Selection Criteria

The applications received will be evaluated according to the following criteria:

- a) The curriculum vitae of applicants.
- b) The statement of purpose of applicants.

Priority will be according to:

- a) Applicants from lower-income countries.
- b) A gender balancing among grant recipients.
